

Jesus is pulling the weight and making straight the path! We will reach the summit because we are yielding our wills and trusting God!

This last line in our corporate prayer About the churches in the Dover District.... has been one of the most touching and humbling prayers for God's answer. Let me share what Union is now beginning to do!





Dover District Prayer Stole Ministry

If you were listening closely the past few Sundays, you have heard Pastor Jim ask for prayers for the Dover District Prayer Ministry. Through the divine inspiration of the Holy Spirit, a powerful idea surfaced at the Prayer Revival planning meeting and was presented to the District on March 11th at the Revival.

The concern that prefaced the blessing is simply this: Our churches are not connected. We can pray fervently for our own individual churches, but what about the whole body of the United Methodist Church in this Dover District? Are we compassionate and caring enough to add to our own corporate longings the powerful prayers of our sister churches? At the Leadership Day held on February 25th, it was heartbreaking to learn how some of our churches are struggling, barely making it. What would happen if we rallied with them to lift up their needs and to support them? What would happen if we all worked together to support the activities within our communities that are dependent upon our assistance,

such as the Home of Hope, which will be in and of itself a God given answer to the prayers of women struggling with addiction, an epidemic in our state? There is power in the name of Jesus! Just think of the power of the prayers of the whole body of Christ known as the Methodist Church of the Dover District! God is calling us to stand up for the love of Jesus Christ and we are ready to do so!

Our response to this awareness was this: We are the UNITED Methodist Church, not the fragmented church. We are called to be intentional in our prayers, not only for the corporate body known as our individual church, but the whole body of the UNITED Methodist Church. On March 11th at the Dover District of the UNITED Methodist Church Prayer Revival, seven prayer stoles were dedicated and blessed in our phase of unity.



The prayer stoles will travel from church to church based upon areas of the district. Our prayer stole will be delivered to our church on Sunday morning April 2nd for us to accept in worship. The prayer stole will be accompanied by a prayer journal in which we will write the corporate prayers of our church (not the intimate private personal prayers, but the prayers that share our church's needs and visions for the future). Corporate prayers are our response to God's longing to intervene in our lives to make the Kingdom of Heaven visible on earth.

What is it that you long to see happen in our church? We will share this with all so that together as a District of UNITED Methodists, we can lift all of these beautiful hopes and dreams before our Lord. Remember, when God plants a vision in our hearts, He has a provision plan in the works!

When the cycle has been completed and the stoles with the journals are returned to Union United Methodist Church in Bridgeville, the prayers will be prepared to be presented at the next Prayer Revival in October, 2017. So, let's joyously receive the stole on April 2nd and share our corporate prayers with the District! What are your hopes and dreams for Union UMC?




