3. We must declare the marvelous deeds the Lord has done both within and outside our walls. Without a doubt through





## Lay Leader's Message *(Notes from Nancy)*

### Are you the ONE?

Indeed this week has been interesting to me. With both knees hurting, I move like molasses and in this slowness, life has been different. I feel as if I have been a fly stuck on the wall, placed by God to hear this chatter, ..... this same message in numerous places, ..... all unrelated and all made by people I know and those I do not know. I have come to the realization that this is not by chance but by design. God wanted me to hear this message and I want to share it with you, my church family.

There is great frustration, anger, angst, and suffering in our world right now. This week, I have heard people say that **God is no longer able or longing to do miracles to intervene for the righteous. ....He is not a God who does miracles. ....He creates and then steps aside and leaves creation to fend for itself. ....I am beginning to doubt God's presence in our world today.**

The comments in and of themselves reflect the discouragement of those who long to see peace and restoration of communities. These words are no different from those found throughout the Bible as Moses wandered through the wilderness; as the Hebrew slaves pounded clay into bricks; and as the Israelites lived in captivity in Babylon. Our story today is not new for truly there is nothing new under the sun as far as how humans treat one another. The Good News is that we have a message of encouragement and hope. We are called to be God's witness of His power and His love and **WE are the instruments that He uses to make miracles happen.** If there are no miracles present in our lives, are we bold enough to examine ourselves instead of God? Are we the ones responsible for the suffering of this world or is God?

Read this account of a miracle from Mark 10: 46-52: <sup>46</sup> *They came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside.* <sup>47</sup> *When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"* <sup>48</sup> *Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"* <sup>49</sup> *Jesus stood still and said, "Call him here." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take heart; get up, he is calling you."* <sup>50</sup> *So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus.* <sup>51</sup> *Then Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man said to him, "My teacher,<sup>[a]</sup> let me see again."* <sup>52</sup> *Jesus said to him, "Go; your faith has made you well." Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.*

This scripture was read on Saturday at the Call to Prayer led by our DS, Dr. Sa. Go back and reread this scripture again for it is critical that we understand that the blind man had awesome faith. He **called out in his belief knowing that Jesus would heal him.** There was **NO** doubt. And then read Jesus's question to the very obviously visually impaired man: **What do you want me to do for you?** Jesus wants to know our hearts. He wants to hear our petitions from our lips. He wants to know what it is that we want from Him.... and then, **He will use us** to show His grace and His mercy and His truth to this discouraged world.

Jesus is calling to you. His words are clear and cannot be ignored. He calls to each of us by name: **Follow me.... Follow me!** There are no excuses that are acceptable for ignoring His call. It is insulting to say to our God that we are not capable, that we have no talents or gifts that He can use. It is He that has made us for His kingdom. He has made each of us perfect in His eyes. It is the world that distorts this message and wants you to believe that you are unworthy or that you have no time for this "church stuff." Your identity is this: **You are the child of God. He adores you and longs for you to come and sit in His presence and to receive His blessings. YOU are the ONE and ONLY to Him, for our God is in all places at all times. He is sitting beside you right now waiting to hear what it is that you long for in your life and for our world. He is ready to use you to make the difference wherever you are. You are His light in this world, so get up and shine! Now!**

I pray with all my heart at this very moment that you are talking with God. He loves you so.



## 25th Annual Apple-Scrapple Festival



- **Craftsmanship:** Do you have the ability to construct or design items to be used within our church for ministry? Are you gifted with craftsmanship that you can use to paint, repair, photograph, ..... For spiritual nurture, faith development, and caring ministries?
- **Encourager:** Are you one who is able to strengthen and comfort those who are hurting or discouraged?
- **Music:** Are you one who enjoys creating or performing lyrics through a variety of art forms?
- **Helper:** Do you feel eagerness to aid or assist others in need?
- **Hospitality:** Do you find joy in providing fellowship, food or care for others?



- **Faith:** Do you feel the calling to inspire others to act and live in complete confidence of God's ability to touch our lives and make us whole?
- **Giving:** Do you enjoy giving so that others may have, knowing and celebrating that all you have is God's gift to you to share with others? Are you able to give in order to contribute to enabling our church to become more of a church in out-reach and love to our members, our community and the world?
- **Telling the story:** Do you find great joy in telling the story of God's love to others so that they join into the Body of Christ?
- **Healing:** Do you have the power to bring restoration to the sick and give the glory to God?

- **Humor:** Are you able to help us remember that God laughs and loves a cheerful heart? Are you able to bring light into despair to help correct false information?




