Devils, Demons, Ghouls, and Spirits! Oh, my! 600HASSLPERNATURAL OPPONENTS

They sacrificed to demons, which are not God—gods they had not known, gods that recently appeared, gods your fathers did not fear. Deuteronomy 32:17

It will be time to get the candy out soon and treat the children who come to our doors! This of course is all in good natured fun of sharing. But, it got me thinking – what about the real spirit world? The one that exist around us every day? You know, the ones the Apostle speaks of so clearly in Ephesians 6:10-13?

Ephesians 6:10-13—10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. **11** Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil.

12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.

Wow! The Apostle Paul, under the direction of the Holy Spirit, (II Tim. 3:16-17) is warning those of us that know and love the Lord Jesus Christ, that this is the opposition we face in this world! And no, I'm not shouting like "Flip Wilson" did in the 70's, "The Devil made me do it!" Opposition to the body of Christ is real and we have real foes.

"Demon," or "devil" as some of the earliest translations rendered the words, is the Greek *daimon* and *daimonion*, the regular terms in the Gospels for the spiritual beings, corrupt and hostile to both God and man, whom Jesus exorcised from their victims in large numbers during his earthly ministry.

These demons were fallen angels, deathless creatures serving Satan (Jesus equated Beelzebub, their reputed prince, with Satan: Matt. 12:24–29). Having joined Satan's rebellion, they were cast out of heaven to await final judgment (2 Pet. 2:4; Jude 6).

Their minds are permanently set to oppose God, goodness, truth, the kingdom of Christ, and the welfare of human beings, and they have real if limited power and freedom of movement, though in Calvin's picturesque phrase "they drag their chains wherever they go and can never hope to overcome God". If we claim it we already have the victory over Satan, death, and hell through Christ victory.

The level and intensity of demonic manifestations in people during Christ's ministry was unique, having no parallel in Old Testament times or since; it was doubtless part of Satan's desperate battle for his kingdom against Christ's attack on it (Matt. 12:29).

Demons were revealed as having knowledge and strength (Mark 1:24; 9:17–27). They inflicted, or at least exploited, physical and mental maladies (Mark 5:1–15; 9:17–18; Luke 11:14). They recognized and feared Christ, to whose authority they were subject (Mark 1:25; 3:11–12; 9:25), though by his own confession it was only through effort in prayer that he was able to expel them (Mark 9:29).



Christ authorized and equipped the Twelve and the seventy to exorcise in his name (by his power and by His authority—Luke 9:1; 10:17).


The ministry of exorcism continues still as an occasional pastoral necessity. The sixteenth-century Lutheran church abolished exorcism, believing that Christ's victory over Satan had suppressed demonic invasion forever, but this was premature.

Satan's army of demons uses subtler strategies also, namely, deception and discouragement in many forms. "Opposing these is the essence of spiritual warfare (Eph. 6:10–18). Though demons can give trouble of many kinds to regenerate persons in whom the Holy Spirit dwells, they cannot finally thwart God's purpose of saving his elect any more than they can finally avoid their own eternal torment. As the devil is God's devil (that is Luther's phrase), so the demons are God's demons, "defeated enemies" (Col. 2:15) whose limited power is prolonged only for the advancement of God's glory as his people contend with them."[1]

Are demons real? Yes. They cannot take possession of God's children but only but can discourage and cause Christ followers to be lead away from properly serving and giving God all their praise and honor which is due Him.

We need to pray for each other every day, give God the glory for that occurs in our lives (think Job) and never deny Him. 
FRIDAY—the streets are open for parking. In the evening, there is the Food Court, Carnival, and Friday night entertainment only.







The Revelation of Jesus Christ Small Group Study

Stay tuned for more information on dates and times for this bible study led by Pastor Mark on the Book of Revelation. The study will take place beginning in October.

The Revelation of Jesus Christ

This small group Bible study will be held at the church for the first meeting and depending on the number of attendees at the parsonage if 10 or less group members.

"The title of the book in the Greek Text is "Apokalypsis Ioannou", "Revelation of John." It is also known as the "Apocalypse, a transliteration of the word "apokalypsis", meaning "unveiling, disclosure, or revelation." Therefore, the book unveils what otherwise could not be known. A better title comes from the first verse, "The Revelation of Jesus Christ." This could be taken as a revelation from Christ or a revelation about Christ. Both are appropriate." (Holy Bible, New King James Version, 1982, Thomas Nelson, Pg. 1924).

This study will look at the introduction, the letters to the churches, and other visions

John had of Jesus. The book uses difficult symbolism and startling imagery to picture the final triumph of God over Satan.

We hope to have a better understanding of the book by the end of the study.

Books that will be used in the study:

"The Bible Knowledge Commentary" will be the main commentary used though others will be used as needed. (The Bible Knowledge Commentary/New Testament, 1983, 2004,

Cook Communications Ministries, Colorado Springs, CO; Paris, Ontario, CA, Kingsway Communications - Eastbourne, England)


This commentary can be purchased new, if desired, on Amazon for \$27.73. At the time I looked there were used copies for less.

There is a copy of "Bible Knowledge Commentary/New Testament" (Pastor Mark's study copy) in the office.

We will also view "Before the Wrath" (DVD) as a group. There may be others as we proceed through the course of study.

There will be other materials that will enhance the study such as articles by scholars and Bible teachers. Discussions will be lively and will be encouraged!

The core notes you will receive were produced for Frontier School of the Bible, LaGrange, Wyoming, for a two credit hour course by Professor Mike Meysenburg. There will be other accessory notes and information as well.

The following additions to our current Bylaws have been proposed and will be voted upon at the annual business meeting planned for Sunday, November 24th immediately following the morning worship service.

- 1) Use of Robert's Rules of Order for all business meetings.
- 2) Voting Any time a vote is required, a simple majority wins.
 If more than two choices are voted upon and a majority is not achieved, the lowest option(s) are dropped and a second vote takes place with the two remaining options. Majority wins.
- 3) Must be a member to have a seat on the Church Council.
- 4) The Pastor does not have a vote at any business meeting or Church Council meeting.

Deadline to submit proposed bylaw changes to the church office is October 15, 2024.
