Gifts of Grace—Romans 12:1-6

1 "I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.

2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

3 For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned.

4 For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, 5 so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. 6 Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith;

7 if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching;

8 the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness."

Soon fall will be upon us! Summer will be over and all the BBQ's, beach trips, and vacations will fade into the past summer as we remember fondly the fun and fellowship we had with family and friends! As we get back to the work God has for us and as we finish out this year a thought came to me about moving forward this fall as a unique body of believers here at Union Methodist. That thought was simple, we all have our place in the ministry here and God has equipped each one of us with gifts that are given by God to support this ministry and more importantly, each other.

An article published some years ago in the *Springfield Oregon Public School News-letter* makes the point that we all have different talents and abilities very well. It said this,

"Once upon a time the animals decided they should do something meaningful to meet the problems of the World they lived in. So, they organized a school. They adopted an activity curriculum of running, climbing, swimming and flying. To make it easier to administer the curriculum, all the animals took all the subjects.

The duck was excellent in swimming. In fact, better than his instructor. But he made only passing grades in flying and was very poor in running. Since he was slow in running, he had to drop swimming and stay after school to practice running. This caused his web feet to be badly worn so that he was only average in swimming. But average was quite acceptable so nobody worried about that except the duck.

The rabbit started at the top of his class in running but developed a nervous twitch in his leg muscles because of so much make-up work in swimming. The squirrel was excellent in climbing but he encountered constant frustration in flying class. The reason was his teacher made him start from the ground up instead of from the treetop down. He developed charley-horses from overexertion and only got a "c" in climbing and a "d" in running.

The eagle was a problem child and was severely disciplined for being a non-conformist. In climbing class he beat all the others to the top of the tree but insisted on using his own way to get there."

Now the obvious moral of the story is simple. Every creature has his own set of capabilities in which it will succeed unless it is expected or forced to fill a mold that it doesn't fit. When that happens, frustration, discouragement, even guilt produce overall mediocrity and ultimately defeat. A duck is a duck and only a duck. It is built to swim, not to run or fly and certainly not to climb. And a squirrel is a squirrel, and so on.



And what is true of these creatures is in a real sense true of Christians in the family of God right here at Union Methodist Church.

God never made us all the same. He made us to be exactly what we are. He planned and designed our differences and He wants us to function in that unique design within the body of Christ. If we don't do that, we miss the whole purpose of what we are created for.

If we get diverted into something else and don't rightly evaluate what we are gifted to do, we will frustrate ourselves and we will produce less than what we were intended to produce.

So we must rightly ascertain and rightly understand our gifts.

First, we present ourselves a living sacrifice (Romans 12:1-2). Then we rightly evaluate and humbly evaluate the gifts that God has graciously given to us.

Secondly, we saw the proper relationship in verse 4, 5 and the beginning of verse 6, notice it. "As we have many members in one body, (he's talking about our physical body), we have many members in our physical body, and yet all members have not the same function, every one of them is different, so (now he is contrasting and comparing) we being many are one body in Christ, that is the church, and every one members one of another having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us."

So, as the body is one and yet many members, so the church is one and yet many members.

And we have, says verse 6, gifts, grace gifts. God-given gifts in our lives as believers sovereignly designed for all of us through which the Holy Spirit ministers to the building up of the church. They are gifts in us through which the Spirit of God can minister. They are for the common good of the whole church.


My gifts are for the church. Your gifts are for the church. They're not for me - mine are not for me, yours are not for you. Mine are for you and yours are for me. That's the way God designed it! We function together as one body!

As we wrap up the summer season and prepare for fall and the holidays, I am looking forward to what God has for us as He uses each members gifts in unique ways. Ducks don't climb and squirrels don't swim but when they use their God given gifts they accomplish what God has for them. As members of the body of Christ, the local church, let's do what God has equipped us to do whether that is soar, climb, swim, or hop. Moving forward, working together, as one body!














WE ARE EXCITED!

The Revelation of Jesus Christ Small Group Study

Stay tuned for more information on dates and times for this bible study led by Pastor Mark on the Book of Revelation. The study will take place beginning in October.

The Revelation of Jesus Christ

This small group Bible study will be held at the church for the first meeting and depending on the number of attendees at the parsonage if 10 or less group members.

"The title of the book in the Greek Text is "Apokalypsis Ioannou", "Revelation of John." It is also known as the "Apocalypse, a transliteration of the word "apokalypsis", meaning "unveiling, disclosure, or revelation." Therefore, the book unveils what otherwise could not be known. A better title comes from the first verse, "The Revelation of Jesus Christ." This could be taken as a revelation from Christ or a revelation about Christ. Both are appropriate." (Holy Bible, New King James Version, 1982, Thomas Nelson, Pg. 1924).

This study will look at the introduction, the letters to the churches, and other visions

John had of Jesus. The book uses difficult symbolism and startling imagery to picture the final triumph of God over Satan.

We hope to have a better understanding of the book by the end of the study.

Books that will be used in the study:

"The Bible Knowledge Commentary" will be the main commentary used though others will be used as needed. (The Bible Knowledge Commentary/New Testament, 1983, 2004,

Cook Communications Ministries, Colorado Springs, CO; Paris, Ontario, CA, Kingsway Communications - Eastbourne, England)


This commentary can be purchased new, if desired, on Amazon for \$27.73. At the time I looked there were used copies for less.

There is a copy of "Bible Knowledge Commentary/New Testament" (Pastor Mark's study copy) in the office.

We will also view "Before the Wrath" (DVD) as a group. There may be others as we proceed through the course of study.

There will be other materials that will enhance the study such as articles by scholars and Bible teachers. Discussions will be lively and will be encouraged!

The core notes you will receive were produced for Frontier School of the Bible, LaGrange, Wyoming, for a two credit hour course by Professor Mike Meysenburg. There will be other accessory notes and information as well.
