

The Story of St. Valentine

Pastor's Page

Happy Valentine's Day!

Or good riddance to Valentine's Day?

Valentine's Day may be one of the most controversial mainstream holidays. One person plans an extravagant romantic trip to Paris, while another yells at

their co-workers for smiling on a day they would rather forget.

It routinely lands in the top 4 holidays for candy sales and greeting cards. I remember making a "Valentine Card Box" at school for everyone in the class to drop their valentines to me in. There were some rules to follow: It had to be **red**, it had to have **hearts** on it, and it should be at least the size of a tissue box (the bigger ones of the day). I looked forward to receiving those cards, some with hearts, some with superheroes, some homemade, and others store -bought. I always ensured I selected the best one to put in the teacher's box because I thought my teacher was the best!

But what is the history and true meaning behind Valentine's Day? Where did it come from? Here is the history of that wonderful day when we celebrate love. Around 265 A.D. the Roman Emperor, Claudius, made a law that young men would not marry. He believed that they would fight with more abandon in war if they did not have a wife and family to worry about back home.

This resulted in a culture that became more and more degraded. Polygamy ran rampant and marriage was abandoned for illegitimate relationships. For young Christian couples desiring to marry this was a difficult time. They wanted to honor God's covenant marriage bond, but Roman law forbade it. They had to choose to follow God or Rome. They already knew of the time when Peter had a similar incident in Jerusalem and told the council, "We should listen to God rather than men." This is where the true history behind St. Valentine made a difference for them.

St. Valentine secretly married and ministered to couples in discrete locations so the Roman soldiers would not find out. He gave his life to help unite men and women in godly marriages and keep them from sinful lifestyles.

He did this for years, all hidden from the eye of the Roman Emperor Claudius. Unfortunately, it was discovered that he was marrying Christian couples. The Roman government under Claudius demanded that he recant his beliefs and become a loyal Roman citizen, but Valentine stood strong on God's



word about marriage. The Roman courts sentenced Valentine to death and it was carried out in the Roman Coliseum.

Before he died, he sent letters out to his friends, many of which he had the chance to marry secretly, and asked them to pray for him and all the Christians in Rome. He urged them to keep their marriages sacred and focused on Christ. He closed each letter with these words, "Remember your Valentine." He was killed on the 14th of February in 270 A.D. This is why we celebrate "Valentine's Day" each year.

Those who know the true history of Valentine and his faithfulness to Christ by his teaching on marriage, which is not as trivial as it has become today.

Valentine stood for something much bigger than himself. He gave his life to give couples a Christian marriage, teach them about Christ, and help them live in a culture that elevated sin and rejected Christ.

As servants in God's ministry, we are doing the same thing. It is the life of each person we work with and teach about Christ. Although we may not always be administering their weddings, we get the incredible opportunity to tell them about Christ and help them win against sin.

Can that be our aim this Valentine's Day and throughout the year? It is much more important than just giving a box of chocolates and a card. (That's important but strengthening marriages is more important.)



Thanks for being a part of this incredible church, and I challenge you to tell those around you, your kids, and grandkids the story of St. Valentine this year. And please, give them those little chalky boxed hearts, chocolate, and cards too! Have a great Valentine's Day!


(NEW Bible Study)
