The Lord's Eyes Are on You!

Summer is upon us! What a wonderful time of year is as we vacation, swim at the beach, BBQ, picnic, and visit!

As we do all these activities, let's remember to keep Our savior, Jesus in all the details.

Speaking of details, it's amazing how the smallest details of the Word can hold such powerful meaning. Today I draw your attention to what is said about the Lord's eyes—eyes that see, and love, and provide.

I often tell my wife, MaryAnn, that she has "smiling eyes." However, our children, used to say, "Mom doesn't have to say anything, she just has to give us the look!" Eyes tell us many things!

In the history of the call of Moses at the burning bush *(Exodus 3:1-17)*, the Lord said,

"I have surely seen the affliction of My people who are in Egypt" (Exodus 3:7).

The direct reference is to the slavery of the Israelites. But we can easily understand them to encompass our suffering today.

These words also reveal the Lord's mercy, for when the Lord sees someone in distress, suffering, or affliction, He has compassion for them! It should be noted also that this took place at the burning bush.

In the Bible, fire is a multifaceted symbol representing both the loving presence and the judgment of God, as well as purification and the Holy Spirit. It can symbolize God's holiness, power, and *communication from heaven*.

Fire also represents God's wrath and the destruction of sin and can be associated with the Holy Spirit's refining work in the Scripture.

This is why it is said of the Lord who appeared amid the seven golden lampstands in the book of Revelation that His eyes were *"like a flame of fire"* (Revelation 1:14).

The symbolism here is of the Lord's divine wisdom, the eyes, united with His Divine love, the fire.

This highlights the way the Lord views us. He cannot turn away from us or even look at us with a frown because to do so would be to violate His very nature, and that can never happen!

There's something powerful about the eyes that we know intuitively.


We say that "The eyes are the window to the soul."

We catch people's attention by, "looking them in the eye."

We know what it means to, "look with loving eyes" on someone. It is the same with the Lord. There is nothing but love—pure love, grace, and mercy for our welfare—in His eyes.

He watches over us constantly, He knows all that is going on, and He is there to help us.

This summer as many things could distract us from His gaze, let's keep our eyes on Jesus. Have a happy and safe summer and keep your hope in the Lord!

Red signifies the "tongues of flame" that appeared among the disciples at Pentecost, 50 days after the Passover.



The History Of Flag Day

The Fourth of July was traditionally celebrated as America's birthday, but the idea of an annual day specifically celebrating the Flag is believed to have first originated in 1885. BJ Cigrand, a schoolteacher, arranged to observe June 14 (the 108th anniversary of the official adoption of The Stars and Stripes) as 'Flag Birthday'.

In 1894, the governor of New York directed that on June 14 the Flag be displayed on all public buildings and the organization known as the American Flag Day Association was organized for the purpose of promoting the holding of Flag Day exercises.

On June 14th, 1894, under the auspices of this association, the first general public school children's celebration of Flag Day in Chicago was held in Douglas, Garfield, Humboldt, Lincoln, and Washington Parks, with more than 300,000 children participating. Adults, too, participated in patriotic programs. Franklin K. Lane, Secretary of the Interior, delivered a 1914 Flag Day address in which he repeated words he said the flag had spoken to him that morning: *"I am what you make"*

me; nothing more. I swing before your eyes as a bright gleam of color, a symbol of yourself."

Inspired by these three decades of state and local celebrations, Flag Day - the anniversary of the Flag Resolution of 1777 - was officially *established* by the Proclamation of President Woodrow Wilson on May 30th, 1916. While Flag Day was celebrated in various communities for years after Wilson's proclamation, it was not until August 3rd, 1949, that President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating **June 14th** of each year as **National Flag Day**.




Colors for the Christian Year

"The Christian year has two cycles: the Christmas Cycle (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter Cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost).

Within each cycle are a preparatory season symbolized by the color purple and a festival season symbolized by the color white.

After each cycle there is an **ordinary time** of growth symbolized the color green. Thus there is a sequence of seasons using purple, white, and green in that order twice each year."



Purple, representing both royalty and penitence, is traditionally used during Advent and Lent.

Blue symbolizes hope and may also be used during Advent.

White and gold are used at Christmas and Easter to symbolize joy and festivities.

Red symbolizes the color of fire to represent the Holy Spirit on the **Day of Pentecost** and times when the work of the Holy Spirit is emphasized. During Holy Week it represents the blood of Christ. Red is also used for ordinations, church anniversaries and civil observances such as **Memorial Day** and **Thanksgiving**.

Green represents growth and is used during **Ordinary Time** (the season after Epiphany and the season after Pentecost.)






