

Our first session will start September 10th and conclude October 22nd with a Family Fun Night for all. Each Recharge gathering will begin with dinner. Next, adults will participate


in a Bible Study or workshop. The children will receive biblical instruction through storytelling, arts and crafts, and music. The evening concludes with a brief devotion and prayer.



Patriot Day, a holiday observed in the United States on September 11 to commemorate the lives of those who died in the 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City and the Pentagon in Virginia and those who perished when the hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in Pennsylvania.




